

## June 10, 2019, 6:30pm, Petit Library Meeting minutes -- DRAFT

- 1. Welcome and introductions:
  Grant Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:35; those present introduced themselves.
- 2. Approval of the May 12 meeting minutes: Alice Honig moved; Natalie Stetson seconded approval; passed with one abstention.
- 3. Fiscal report: Natalie Stetson reported: \$249.49 (money available to pay for domain hosting, etc.); \$1,073.03 (\$.14 interest) in planter fund; and \$2,594.28 (\$.35 interest) in savings.
- 4. Neighborhood SPD report:
  - Lt. Lindgren introduced himself and did not have detailed statistics, but reported on the reorganization into 3 districts, with the eastern of which we are part, being overall the safest, with the lowest levels of violent crime. Break-ins are up in the university area since students left for the summer. SU is seeking funding for more cameras in the area. He discussed changes to the community policing efforts, stating that it was no longer a recognized unit, but a "concept" which makes every officer a community policing officer. He also stressed recent staff reductions. Finally he urged folks to lock cars and not leave keys in. JAE raised problems with reporting parking violations via 911 and emphasized need for ticket writers. Lt. - 5. Business: Old
  - UNSAAC 2018-2019 Update:
     Grant recapped the plans to replace and add new trash cans (with a recycling component) in the neighborhood. He and Damian are scheduled to meet this week with DPW to work out details.
  - WNA officers term limits quandary:

All have served beyond limits set in by-laws. In the spirit of keeping the organization moving along, it was proposed to grant a term extension until April 2020. Alice Honig moved and Glenda Rinallo seconded the motion to do this; pass unanimously. Discussion then segued into alternative organization models such a co-presidents, or, an executive officer.

- 315 Alive / Public art Jake Roberts Jake introduced the program, focused on the role of public art in place making, highlighting installations already in place, such as the mural at Geddes and Fayette and sites already approved, including 6 on the former Sibley's, currently the Redhouse, building. The group has scoped out a number of possible locations in the Westcott area, including the walls bordering the public parking area and the wall bordering Dorian's parking lot. Jake asked for volunteers to plan an art program in the Westcott area. Jake is one possibility for repairing the Michael Moody mural at S. Beech and Westcott.
